Bel Air is comprised of over 300 single family residences and a combination of approximately 150 rental units and business locations.

Brief History

Bel Air consists of three separate subdivisions - Kearnie Estates, Eugene Place and Bel Air. Most of the homes in the neighborhood were completed between 1949 and 1952 by the Porter Womack Construction Company. While the neighborhood is not a designated historic district, there are many unique homes in the neighborhood that reflect the architectural style of the time.

About the Association

The Bel Air Neighborhood Association (BANA) was formed in May 1995 by a group of residents. The purpose of BANA is to achieve and preserve a safe, attractive and valued neighborhood with a sense of pride, responsibility and cooperative involvement. BANA is governed by a volunteer board elected by the residents. We are not a homeowner's association and there are no association dues. BANA keeps residents informed through a bi-monthly newsletter, quarterly general meetings and many activities throughout the year.
