Block Watch Grant Account:

Traffic Committee - Roshelle

In order for speed humps to be installed, at least 70 percent of residences within the petition boundary must approve, and all residences within 100 feet of a speed hump must approve. The required approval from residences for speed humps to be installed on Heatherbrae Dr. between 17th Ave. and 19th Ave. was not able to be obtained. The committee is considering installing some drought tolerant plants in the alley located behind the China Buffet in order to discourage transients in the area.

The Westwood Neighborhood had received information about Metro Light Rail and the Grand Opening on Saturday, Dec. 27th. The cost to have a booth on that day for neighborhoods not located right on the light rail route was apx. \$1000. There was an auto theft at an engine center of a \$75,000 Mercedes. FIGHT BACK CRIME COMMITTEE UPDATE

• The Phone Tree

One of the Crime Prevention Committee's goals is to establish a phone tree for each block in the BelAir neighborhood. To accomplish this goal, a blank phone tree form was sent to each of the households in our neighborhood. We need volunteers (in addition to our Bel Air board members) to fill out their forms with as much of their nearby neighbors' contact information as reasonably possible. Volunteers are only being asked to fill in the information on the phone tree form about neighbors whom they are already comfortable approaching. The volunteers are to keep this information for their own personal use in case of an activation of our Bel Air Phone Tree.

The sign up form has a place for your name and contact information that the Bel Air Neighborhood Association Board Members can use to contact you in case of an activation of our Bel Air Phone Tree. Mrs. Vida Irene Rhoades, one of our Bel Air neighborhood's beloved original homeowners, passed away on February 4th, 2009. She celebrated her 98th birthday last August.

Vida and her husband, Robert "Bob" Rhoades. bought their home on Heatherbrae Drive in April 1948. Mrs. Rhoades often noted that, when they moved into the neighborhood, the Hawkins' were their next door neighbors to the east because it was the only house on that side of Heatherbrae Drive that had been built so far. The Rhoades' moved here with their teenage daughter, Gerry, after Bob was transferred from El Paso, TX. Bob worked for Lindy Air Products, which later became known as Arizona Welding Supply. During World War II. Bob worked delivering liquid oxygen to White Sands, NM for use in testing rockets. Mrs. Rhoades and her husband enjoyed 61 wonderful years of marriage prior to his passing.

Mrs. Rhoades and her daughter, Gerry, helped build the American Evangelical Lutheran Church on Glenrosa Avenue. Vida spent a lot of time volunteering at the church. She was highly involved in the Ladies' Missionaries group, while her daughter has many happy memories from being in the Luther League.

Mrs. Rhoades is survived by her daughter, Gerry Jeardoe (Gene) of Phoenix; her granddaughters, Julie Veatch (Jaime) FL, Janet Clark (Craig) Mesa; her many great, great great, and step grandchildren; her sister, Lutie Parkin, TX; her nieces and nephews.
