1. The March 9, 2002 BelAir Neighborhood Association Board Meeting was called to order at 9:00 am, in the Fireside Room at Martin Luther School, at 1830 West Glenrosa. All members were present except Marjorie Paez and Debbie Dumone.

2. The minutes for January and February were approved as amended. The Treasurers Report for January and February was approved as presented.

3. The 301 Block Watch Alley Lighting Committee reported that it has placed five alley lights this year. They will also re-allocate funds to pay the electricity on the ten existing alley lights that are coming to the end of their three year contract with APS. Any other funds will be re-allocated for security doors for people who had signed up by the deadline but who didn't win one in the raffle at our last general meeting. Names will be drawn from those already submitted by the deadline Dec. 31, 2001. Stay Tuned.

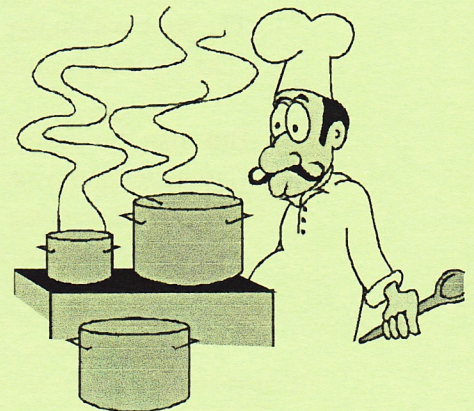
