Neighborhood Update

On Saturday, December 8, 2001, over 1000 people gathered at the Kids Street Park on 23rd Ave, for a Christmas party sponsored by the Westwood Business Alliance. Over 800 stockings were filled with presents and handed out to the children of the neighborhood. Refreshments were served to all in attendance.

On Thursday, January 10, 2002, over 100 residents gathered at Westwood Elementary School to celebrate the remodeling of the large apartment complex on Campbell Ave. and the 1-17 access road, and to welcome and congratulate the new owner of the complex, now called Emerald Park. Also in attendance were the representatives of the former owners, who expressed their apologies to the neighborhood for letting the old complex become an eyesore and health hazard. Had they not apologized, they would have been fined \$250,000. The new owners of Emerald Park invested \$1,700,000 in remodeling costs.

Also on Thursday, January 10, 2002, a drug bust went down in the Westwood neighborhood involving a drug ring from Canada. Several arrests were made.

On Saturday, January 12, 2002, at 12:30 pm, a ribbon cutting ceremony was held at the new Emerald Park Apartment Complex. Phil Gordon, our area City Councilman, shared in the festivities.

On Saturday, 19, 2002, a groundbreaking ceremony was held at the Kids Street Park, to begin construction on the new Community Center.

In early December, about 1500 bikers held a fund raiser for a monument for Kids Street park, in memory of Mark Atkinson, a police officer killed in the line of duty. Over \$10,000 was raised.
