Every Wednesday the Arizona Republic publishes a crime log Central Phoenix the Community Section. Crime Log is divided by zip code. It lists the time, date, location, and type of crime. The log includes eight types of homicide. crime: sexual assault, robery, aggravated assault, burglary, theft, auto theft, and drug crimes. Phoenix Police Department hopes that by providing this information people will have a chance to see exactly what is happening in their immediate community so that they can take precautions or provide information to help the police better serve us.
