Minute To Minute By Todd Brueshoff

The February 12, 2000 Board Meeting was held in the Fireside Room at Martin Luther School, 1830 W. Glenrosa. The meeting was called to order at 9:08a.m.

Minutes from the January meeting were approved as written. The Treasurer's reports for the General Fund and 301 Grant were approved as submitted.

1999 301 Grant - The installation of the alley lights is still in progress. APS informed the Board that the four neighbors that were bordered by the lights need to be notified. Copies of area maps and letters were given to the volunteers to deliver them to the affected neighbors. Once they are notified, the lights can be installed.

2000 301 Grant - The total for the 2000 Grant is \$9,998.00. The projects included in the grant are additional alley lighting, office supplies, weed spray, security door money, and medical alert funding. We will know in June if we receive the grant money. Sharon Barger also reported that the fire department is interested in co-writing a grant next year with our neighborhood. This would be in addition to our individual grant. The purpose of the grant would be for training on security and safety. The Board approved her following up with the fire department.

Newsletter - The key to the newsletter being delivered on time following the deadlines. Volunteers do all the components that prepare the newsletter. If anyone is interested in writing articles for the newsletter, they are encouraged to do so.

Spring Neighborhood Clean Up -The spring clean up took place on February 19, 2000. Look for an article in this newsletter for more information about that event. In order to provide supplies for the clean up, the Board agreed to spend up to \$50.00 to purchase at least 40 garbage bags. The funds would come from the 301 Grant if there were funds allocated for this purpose, if not, the money would come from the General Fund.


New Neighbor Packets - The Board approved using 301 Grant money to prepare 50 more packets. If anyone knows of a neighbor that would need a packet, please call the neighborhood hotline.

Yard Sale - The Annual Neighborhood Yard Sale will be held on April 29, 2000 beginning at 8 a.m. It is later this year due to Easter being late in the spring. Look for an article in this newsletter for details.

General Meeting & Election - The next General Meeting will be held on April 8, 2000 at 7 p.m. This will include the election of six new Board members. The committee members are Laurel Moran, Tom Bentley, Pastor Wilfong and Sharon Barger.

Other - There was a discussion about property taxes and if they were going up on everyone's home. There was agreement on that issue and that it was due to the rising home prices for our neighborhood. The prices have increased quite a bit in a short amount of time. Neighborhoods That Work banquet is being held on May 24th. One of the bulletin boards was vandalized and the cork needs to be replaced.

What You Can Do!

Look for your letter from the Census Bureau in March. Return the enclosed postcard if you need the questionnaire in your preferred language.

Fill out your questionnaire and send it back by April 1, 2000. Make sure everyone in your household is counted, including children.

Encourage all residents to be counted, including undocumented workers and winter visitors.

Remember, no one will see your responses. It is illegal for the Census Bureau to share information with INS or police.

An accurate count is critical to the city because federal and state funds are distributed to local governments based their on population.

Children 8 Teens

Need ALL Immunizations

The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends that by age 2, your child should have received the following shots:

*Four DTP (diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis).

*Three polio

*One MMR (measles, mumps, rubella).

*Three hepatitis B.

*Two to four Hib (Haemophilus influenzae type b) with at least one dose after age 1.

*VZV (varicella) for chickenpox.

The Arizona State Department of Education mandates that before children start kindergarten, they will need boosters for DTP and polio, and a second dose of MMR. Some children may need the hepatitis A before kindergarten, preschool or day care.

Teens need shots too. Many teens missed the second dose of MMR. which was added to the schedule in recent years. Hepatitus B also was recently added to the schedule. If a teen has not had chickenpox, it is recommended that he or she receive the single chickenpox shot before age 13. Your teen also will need a tetanus diphtheria booster.
