

Minute To Minute By Todd Brueshoff

The June 10, 2000 Board Meeting was held in the Fireside Room at Martin Luther School, 1830 W. Glenrosa. The meeting was called to order at 9:06 a.m.

All board members were present except for Pastor Charles Wilfong who was out of town.

Minutes from the May meeting were accepted with one minor correction. The Treasurer's reports for the General Fund and the 301 Grant were accepted as submitted.

301 Grants - The fiscal year for the 1999-2000 grant is coming to a close. Laurel Moran will write a letter to the grant committee asking to reallocate funds from areas that have surpluses. We will use the money to purchase items that can be used at future general meetings. Any money not used by the end of June must be returned to the city. We were approved for the entire grant amount for the 2000-01 grant. The money will be picked up on June 17th.

July 18th General Meeting - Jim that the Mathew reported committee has met. There will be a picnic theme for the meeting. The Association will be providing hot-dogs and chips. There has been interest in the committee for traffic through the neighborhood and those members will be announced at the meeting. A motion was made by Sharon Barger and seconded by Susan Thompson-McHugh to allocate up to \$125 from the General Fund to help with expenses. The meeting will begin at 6pm with set up at 5pm.

Neighborhood Workshop Update - Sharon and Carol Adamson attended the workshops that were part of the national neighborhood conference held in Phoenix. Some of the workshops attended were about writing grants, community newsletters, and organizations information. The overall feeling was that there was a lot of useful information and it was a very positive experience.

Fall Festival - The committee for the Fall Festival that will coincide with the annual G.A.I.N. was selected. Tim Blevins chairs the committee. Other members are Marjorie Paez, Jeannie Garcia, Jim, Carol, Anna Blevins and Judy Mathew. They will hold their first committee meeting in the near future.

Fundraising Idea - An exploratory committee has been formed to look into making stepping stones for possible prizes at meetings or fund-raisers. The committee consists of Jim, Susan, Carol, Marjorie, Tim and Georgia Thomas. They will begin their work by looking into material costs.

Board Vacancy Laurel announced to the Board that she is moving out of the neighborhood by the end of June. There will be a vacancy on the Board that will need to be filled. This will be discussed at the next meeting. Tim agreed to take over as Treasurer for the Association.

Meeting was adjourned at 10:35 am. The next Board Meeting will be on July 8, 2000. Please check with any Board member as to location.


