Old Business: Virginia has not heard from Lisa Huggins-Hubbard yet about the canal access project. In their last conversation she had told her she expected to have held the bidding meeting by the end of the first week in September, if not sooner. She will check back with her then at the end of next week.

G.A.I.N.: Jeanne checked with Sheri in the church office, who said the gym is available for the G.A.I.N. event from 5p.m. - 7p.m. on October 15, but there won't be any air conditioning. The board discussed the merits of holding it inside versus outside, as a street event. The two or three prior outdoor G.A.I.N. events were quite successful. Since the church kitchen isn't available for cooking, only coordination of already-cooked items, and the kitchen would be too warm, the board opted for a street barbecue instead. Jeanne will check with the police about blocking off the street. Sharon made a motion to set aside \$150.00 for event supplies. The board unanimously approved the motion.

Community Garden: Jeanne was pleased to see the community garden discussion started on the BelAir website. She is developing a questionnaire on a possible BelAir garden for the neighbors.



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Crime Prevention: Virginia wants to try a new approach to the committee since very few neighbors have been involved in the past. The purpose of the committee is open-ended, so it needs to be re-formed.

Block Watch Grant Committee: Carrie reported that the insurance payment is due shortly. She is waiting for the checks to arrive to pay some pre-approved expenses.

Newsletter-Website Committee: Carrie and Virginia have met twice so far. Virginia has familiarized herself more with the BelAir web page. We will include monthly information on gardening.

New Business: Carolyn McBane, our neighborhood guest for the meeting, brought us an opportunity to participate in an informal survey being conducted by V.I.P., Valley Interfaith Project. She volunteers with them through her church, Asbury UMC. V.I.P. a twenty-year-old, bi-partisan organization, conducts annual information- gathering sessions as house-to-house interviews and in small groups through neighborhoods, churches, synagogues, schools, and other public settings. The information is then forwarded to the State legislature to educate the elected representatives on community problems and issues. The year Asbury is contacting neighborhood associations in Central Phoenix to send facilitators for small group conversations on such issues at general meetings. Carolyn asked if her group could attend our G.A.I.N. event and facilitate one of these neighborhood conversations. She and perhaps another volunteer would listen and take notes to add to the current V.I.P. survey. Mike made a motion to include the V.I.P. workshop at the conclusion of the G.A.I.N. event's business meeting. The board unanimously approved the motion.

Old Business: Jeanne said we need to start gathering the cactus plants neighbors have offered for the canal access beautification. The plants will form an organic fence rather than constructing an artificial wall. This is a preferable design in accord with the environmentally focused plan for the canal crossing.

Computer Purchase: The board is still researching a laptop for the board's use, which is part of the Block Watch grant.

III. New Business

August meeting minutes approved, after minor corrections Treasurer's Report was accepted as presented
