Board Meeting Minutes - March 5th

Date: March 5th, 2012

Attendees: Jeanne Greene, Sharon Bushouse, Katie Hamm, Mike Radtke, Wayne Harmon, Carrie Frazer, Virginia Anders

I. Call to Order

- **II. Minutes -** Reviewed and approved board meeting minutes, pending three corrections. Virginia was reminded to post the draft minutes within the week after the meeting.
- **III. Treasurer's Report** Jeanne gave Mike a receipt for \$25.61 supplies for the sunflower seeds project.

IV. Committees

- A. Canal Access engineering Mike noted that the slide gate on the east side of each bridge won't be installed until the concrete hardens fully on the basic structure. He said he will monitor this.
- B. **Beautification** The board discussed possible planting for the bridge area. Several board members have cactus and succulent plants to offer low maintenance planting is preferred.
- C. **Community Enhancement** Jeanne and Sharon combined efforts to acquire seeds and small plastic bags for the sunflower project which will accompany the next newsletter. They will get the bags to Carrie in time for the next newsletter deliveries.
- D. Gardening Committee Jeanne told the board most of
- the first planting is done: radishes, lettuce, Bok Choy, and some tomato plants. Early comments from passersby are very positive.
- E. Crime Prevention Virginia said the 25-hour requirement for new recruits to the PNP program has been waived, including retroactively. She will contact Dan Hancock tonight to set up a meeting to review objectives.
- F. Next General Meeting May 19, Time: 9 – 11a.m. The board discussed potential topics: summer safety? Pool safety? a speaker from the Diabetes Association?
- G. Block Watch Committee Carrie noted the current balance for the 2011 Block Watch Grant, and said the balance by June 30, 2012 must be zero. Therefore, any unexpended monies by that date must be sent back to the City. All new neighborhood-approved street lights have been installed. The board

approved the remaining 2 City-approved items from the 2011 budget, \$100 for plants and \$200 for miscellaneous printing from the grant budget.

- H. **Fight Back Grant** Katie Hamm checked with the City of Phoenix, and said there is no more money available for further projects.
- I. Newsletter/Website Committee The next newsletter will be ready by this Friday, with a seed packet attached to each newsletter.
- VI. Old Business There are two openings on the current board, and five more possible openings for the May 2012 general meeting, when current terms expire. Jeanne urged the current members to consider remaining on the board. Mike will facilitate the closing of the BelAirNH@Yahoo.com website.
- VII. The Melrose Street Fair Carrie and Wayne reported that the fair was very well attended and the BelAir booth had plenty of visitors. There were enough volunteers to staff the booth all day, from the 11 a.m. opening to the 6 p.m. close.
